What are the adverse effects of Formaldehyde?

Short Term Effects on Individuals:

- Watery/burning sensation of the eyes, and burning of the nose and throat
- Wheezing, nausea and skin irritation
- Long Term Effects on Individuals:

EPA has classified formaldehyde as a probable human carcinogen – meaning that it causes cancer in animals and likely in humans.
